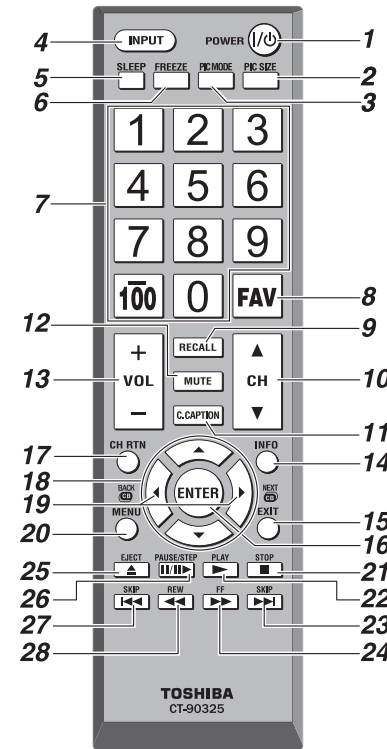

NOTE The error message "NOT AVAILABLE" may appear if you press a button for a function that is not available.



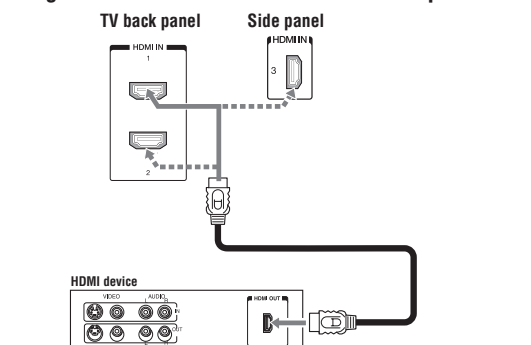
(Sample Illustration) Remote control overview

Item:	Description:	Function:
1	POWER button	Turns the TV On and Off. When the TV is on, the power LED indicator on the front of the TV glows green.
2	PIC SIZE button	Cycles through the picture sizes, see the "Selecting the picture size" section in the User's Guide.
3	PIC MODE button	Selects the picture mode, see the "Selecting the picture mode" section in the User's Guide.
4	INPUT button	Selects the video input source, see the "Selecting the video input source" section in the User's Guide.
5	SLEEP button	Accesses the sleep timer, see the "Setting the sleep timer" section in the User's Guide.
6	FREEZE button	Freezes the picture. Press again to restore the moving picture, see the "Using the FREEZE feature" section in the User's Guide.
7	Channel Number buttons (0-9)	Directly tunes channels. The 100 button allows you to enter two part channel numbers, see the "Storing channels in memory (optional)" section, or to edit the Favorites List, see the "Favorites browser" section in the User's Guide.
8	FAV button	Accesses the Favorites List in the Channel Browser, see the "Favorites browser" section in the User's Guide.
9	RECALL button	Displays TV status information.
10	CH (▲/▼) buttons	Cycles through programmed channels.
11	C. CAPTION button	Accesses closed captions, see the "Using closed captions" section in the User's Guide.
12	MUTE button	Reduces or turns off the sound, see the "Muting the sound" section in the User's Guide.
13	VOL (+/-) buttons	Adjusts the volume level.
14	INFO button	Displays TV status information as well as program details, when available, see the "Displaying TV information" section in the User's Guide.
15	EXIT button	Closes on-screen menus.
16	ENTER button	Activates highlighted items in the main menu system.
17	CH RTN button	Returns to the last viewed channel or source, see the "Switching between two channels using Channel Return" section in the User's Guide.
18	(▲/▼/◀/▶) buttons	Selects or adjusts programming menus when a menu is on-screen.
19	(◀/▶) buttons	Opens the Channel Browser and tunes to the previous/next channel in the channel history when TV programming is on-screen. See the "Tuning channels using the Channel Browser" section in the User's Guide.
20	MENU button	Accesses the main TV menu system. See the "Navigating the menu system" section in the User's Guide.
21-28	Playback buttons	Controls the HDMI™ CEC compatible devices. See "Learning about the remote control" section in the User's Guide.

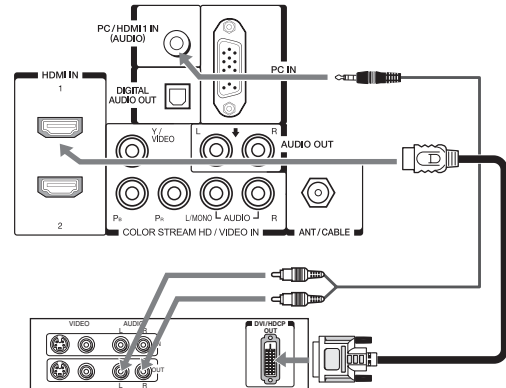

Connecting an HDMI™ or DVI device to the HDMI™ input



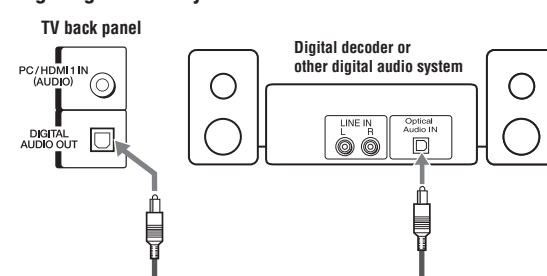
(Sample Illustration) Connecting an HDMI™ device

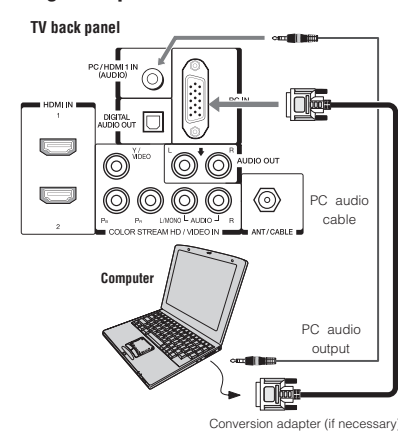
Connecting a digital audio system

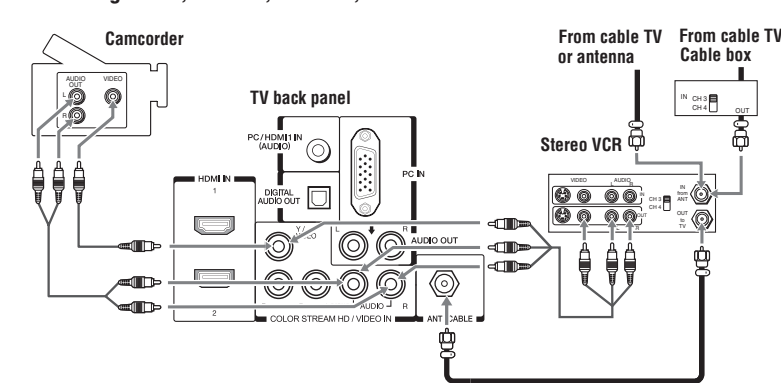

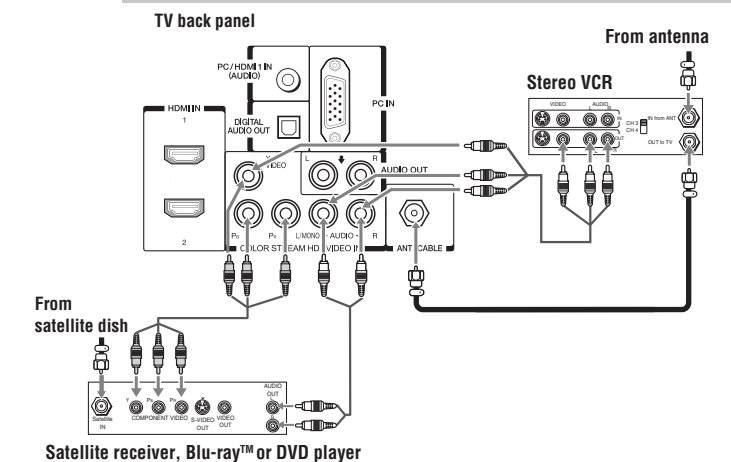
(Sample Illustration) Connecting to a VCR, antenna, or cable TV or camcorder
